Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are partner celebrations this year. Let's make the most of it! As Lent begins, we are invited to reflect on the depth and quality of our relationship with Jesus, whose life, death, and resurrection reflect God's great love in the world. The question is: How am I captivated by Jesus, who invites me to pray the way I am able in the moment? This retreat will focus on prayer as the art of simply being oneself before a loving God, who gifts us Lenten grace leading to resurrection.

The Sojourner's Well: Refreshment for Spiritual Directors

The theme for this 2024 series is *Deepening Our Spirituality with Mindfulness: Practices for Spiritual Directors*. These sessions are geared towards those who are active in the ministry of Spiritual Direction and are **for spiritual directors only**. Each session will consist of content as well as reflection, dialogue, and formation of small communities.

Introduction to Mindfulness Practice

Saturday, January 27, 2024, 8:30 AM-Noon Pacific, in person and via Zoom *Presenter: Gail Stearns, PhD*

We will learn and discuss the basic premise of "Mindfulness" practice, to help us all get started on the same page, whether we are new to or already familiar with mindfulness. This will include participating in basic practice exercises of mindful meditation. Mindfulness can be "used" in many ways, as you will discover. There are two very positive uses we will explore: mindfulness for immediate stress relief or calm; and mindfulness as a habit that may foster longer-term effects like greater awareness of our own feelings of reactivity or judgement as they arise when engaging as spiritual directors. Participants will leave with choices of exercises to practice on their own, and ways to experiment with integrating these into existing prayer practices.

Relational Mindfulness

Saturday, May 18, 2024, 8:30 AM-Noon Pacific, in person and via Zoom *Presenter: Gail Stearns, PhD*

In this session, we will focus on "relational mindfulness," and how to listen even more intently as spiritual directors. We will discuss how the stressors of a person we are listening to may be uniquely connected to their particular identities and communities, and what might constitute real happiness for them. We will continue to learn daily mindfulness practices toward developing a habit of mindful living, including mindful eating and mindful walking techniques. We will have ample opportunity to share with one another, and to discuss discoveries from any mindfulness practices we engaged in since the last session.

Mindfulness of Thought and Emotion

Saturday, August 31, 2024, 8:30 AM-Noon Pacific, in person and via Zoom *Presenter: Gail Stearns, PhD*

Focusing in greater depth on mindful observation of our thoughts and emotions, we will learn the practice of "RAINN" for our own use and for possible use with our directees. Together, we will explore more deeply how we might integrate mindfulness practices with Christian prayer and practice, or help our directees integrate mindfulness exercises with other religious or spiritual practices as appropriate.

Mindfulness for Living Our Christian Faith in Service

Saturday, October 26, 2024, 8:30 AM-Noon Pacific, in person and via Zoom *Presenter: Gail Stearns, PhD*

In this final session, we will share what these months of living mindfully, or of occasional engagement with mindfulness, have taught us. We will explore a full understanding of how the tools of mindfulness might help us to personally live our faith more fully and how they enhance our presence as spiritual directors. Examining more in depth the Christian roots of mindfulness practice, we will take time to practice these in a deeper way with one another, leaving with ideas of how to continue to engage with these practices.

Discernment: Exploring the Call A Reflection/ Education Series

Presented by: Sister Karin Nürnberg, CSJ, and Team

This 9-month series for women provides invaluable information about religious life in monastic, contemplative, or apostolic communities. We discuss community and ministry, the Eucharist, and the vows. Participants also experience different forms of personal prayer and learn how to discern and to understand the movements of the heart. Former participants have found the program very informative and helpful in discerning a call to religious life, a lay institute, an associate program, Third Order, or to service. Others have found the information beneficial and desired to support those moving through a discernment process.

Each formal gathering is two hours and is accompanied by a handout for further reading and reflection. The sessions consist of prayer, input, and questions / discussion, and also include Sunday Mass and brunch. If you are currently meeting with a Vocation Director, we recommend that you share the information with her for discussion.

The sessions are on the second Sunday of the month unless they fall on a holiday weekend; in this case, they are moved to an alternate Sunday. Those who do not live locally may arrange to attend Zoom sessions of Exploring the Call at a time mutually convenient to themselves and the Vocation Team.

You may register for one, several, or all sessions.

The Art of Spiritual Direction A Training and Formation Program for Spiritual Directors

The Art of Spiritual Direction (ASD) is a 3-year program for individuals who discern in themselves a call to the ministry of spiritual direction. It provides a holistic curriculum integrating theology, spirituality, skills development, psychology, Scripture, and supervision in the art of spiritual direction.

Classes are held on 10 Saturdays each year, September to June. Sessions feature content, guided reflection questions, small group conversations, reading, and journaling. The program also includes practicum sessions.

Successful completion of the 3-year program earns a certificate of completion from both the Center for Spiritual Development and the Center for Religion and Spirituality at Loyola Marymount University.
